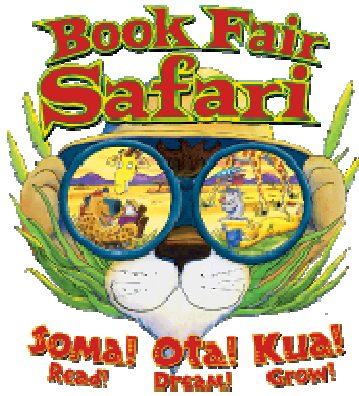
## Alumni News
