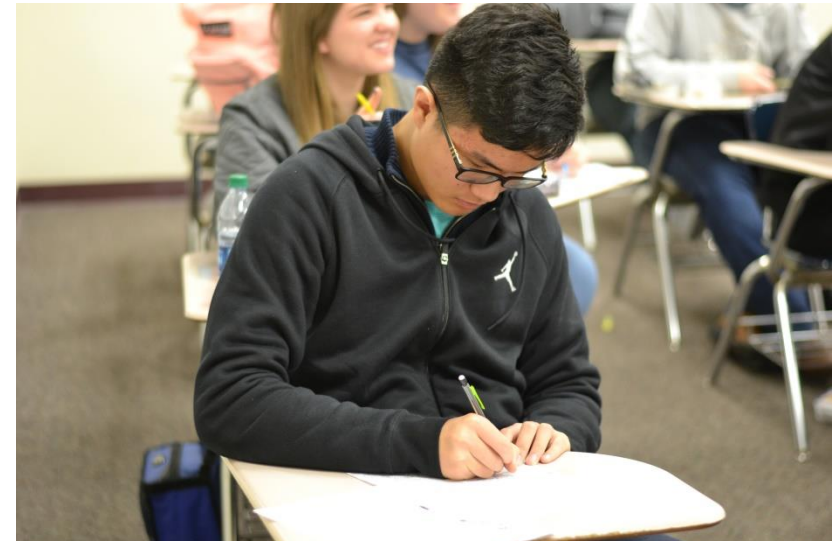
High Point Christian Academy

Over 650 students attend HPCA with 240 in grades 9-12. Admission is open to all qualified students and is based on academic records, admission testing, recommendations, and personal interview.

International Students



HPCA is an F-1 approved school. Students are accepted from around the world to learn, study, and share life in the hospitality and security of an American, Christian home. Students from South Korea, China, Germany, Vietnam, Croatia, Nigeria, Brazil, Lithuania, Japan, Hungary, Canada, and Mexico have become HPCA Cougars, graduating and continuing their education at top American universities.



High School Academics



We have had 13 graduating classes with 708 graduates. Our most recent 61 graduates, the class of 2018, earned over \$4.8 million in academic and athletic scholarships.

Our academic program is rigorous. All of our high school teachers are committed Christians with credentials to teach their subject areas.

We offer three different levels of courses – College Prep, Honors, and Advanced Placement (AP). All three levels of courses are designed to prepare our students for the academic rigor of college.

Not only do our teachers teach students their subjects effectively but more importantly they love their students and understand the importance of building lasting relationships!



GPA and Ranking



Grade point averages are calculated on a weighted scale based on the final grades. The complete GPA scale can be found on the HPCA website.

Classes are calculated with the CP scale unless specified Honors or AP. We do not rank students; however, class standing is determined by the weighted GPA of all grades earned at HPCA and reported in 1st, 2nd, top ten and quintiles if requested.

Grades earned at other schools apply toward graduation requirements but are not calculated into the weighted GPA.

Ninety five percent of the senior class entered a four year university.



Academic Excellence



HPCA has had three National Merit Finalists and three Semi-Finalists.

All students enrolled in AP courses take the AP exam associated with that course. Our pass rate for AP exams was over 72% for the 2017-18 school year.



The average ACT score for the Class of 2018 was 23 with 92% participation. The average SAT score was 1173 (EBRW and Math).

Technology



HPCA has a vision of a student-centric learning environment, in which the use of technology is routine, transparent, and supports curricular goals. We continue to leverage new, educational technology resources.

We implement a 1:1 program where each student was issued a Chromebook™, which provides an opportunity for seamless integration of technology in the classroom. Students will be able to expand their digital literacy within a Biblical context under the guidance of HPCA teachers. Having student devices in the classroom setting will also enhance our students' college preparedness, as many college courses are increasingly available online.



The learning management system, Canvas, gives students and parents online access to assignments and feedback from teachers. Canvas also enables teachers to deliver multimedia content and is an excellent platform for the use of 21st century learning tools.

Fine Arts



High school students who participate in fine arts classes may work in the areas of visual art, photography, yearbook, band, choir, and drama.

As students go through their high school career they will be increasingly challenged with a broader and deeper understanding of their individual discipline.

A wide variety of opportunities are available for students including community and school art shows, music festivals, competitions, concerts, community performances, play productions, and ministry opportunities in all areas.

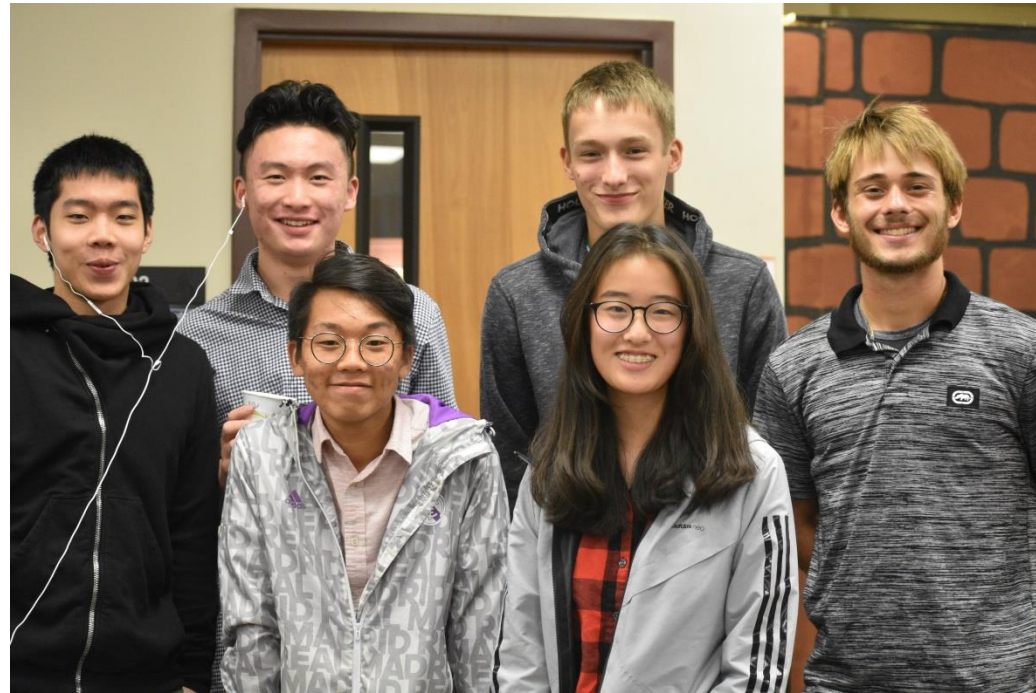


Dining Services
